### TOPICS DISCUSSED

- Minutes.** Gail Gibbons moved and Lori Block seconded that the July and August minutes be approved as presented. **Motions passed.**  
Lori Block moved and Anna Wheeler seconded that the notes of the committee's special meeting regarding the public awareness campaign be accepted and posted with other committee minutes. **Motion passed.**
- AZCEH Conference.** Leslie Carlson reminded participants that she will be one of three presenters of "Beyond the Comfort Zone: Reaching Out for New Leadership" at the Arizona Coalition to End Homelessness (AZCEH) annual conference in Phoenix, October 18<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup>. The October 18<sup>th</sup> session reviews the experiences of Phoenix, Sierra Vista, and Tucson in seeking community leadership outside the human services sector.
- Homeless Data for Tucson/Pima County.** Participants reviewed and discussed an updated table of estimates of homelessness in Pima County that includes school data. Leslie noted that she presented the summary along with the HMIS report to the Metropolitan Housing Commission, whose members were very interested. Lori Block moved that the updated version be accepted. Gail Gibbons seconded. **Motion passed.**
- 100,000 Homes Campaign update/ PTEH Coordinator involvement.** Linda and Leslie noted that the September General Council approved formation of a TPC 100,000 Homes Campaign Workgroup to move forward with the local effort. Participants discussed whether and what type of support the PTEH Coordinator should provide to that workgroup. It was noted that Leslie's administrative support of the feasibility group was essential and laid a basis for moving forward, but that ongoing administrative support would not be the highest use of PTEH coordinator time. Consensus was that TPC would benefit most from the use of Leslie's leadership skills, and that her work in this regard should be described as "to participate in the 100,000 Homes Campaign Workgroup to provide advocacy and education toward implementing the campaign."
- Public awareness campaign.** Participants received a copy of contractor LP&G's campaign recommendations with the meeting reminder. Having used the scheduled meeting time, they reached consensus to hold a special campaign planning meeting Thursday, October 7<sup>th</sup>, 3:00-4:30 p.m.
  - Next step.** Leslie will reserve a room for the October 7<sup>th</sup> meeting. [Pantano Room was obtained.]
